Under her watch as Board Chair and Immediate Past Board Chair, the \$12 million Phase I goal was exceeded and announcement of Phase II and III is imminent. Pam continues her involvement through her seat on the Capital Campaign Steering Committee, helping to develop strategy and close the ultimate gifts necessary to reach an additional \$8 million to finish the project. Her efforts have been tireless and consistent throughout the many events that have taken place in her personal life and she has never lost sight of the ultimate goal – to open the New Elliott Museum in 2013! Her personal gift of \$25,000 to name the theatre in the new museum for her parents is a tribute to her belief in preserving history and honoring those philanthropist’s that came before her – her parents and grandparents.
