- ◆ Tax returns for at least 2 years
- ◆ Photographs
- ◆ Baby books, Scrapbooks

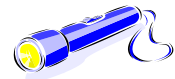

Family Disaster Supplies—ready any time

- ◆ 1 gallon of water per person per day for drinking
- ◆ Flashlight and extra batteries
- ◆ Battery-powered radio, T V and extra batteries
- ◆ Battery-powered lights and extra batteries
- ◆ Basic tools (hammer, wrench, pliers)
- ◆ Duct tape & electrical tape
- ◆ Corded telephone (old style—not cordless)
- ◆ Paper products for eating, cleaning
- ◆ Soap, sponge, rags, cleaner, hand sanitizer
- ◆ Unscented household bleach
- ◆ CASH in small bills.
- ◆ Non-perishable food for 7 days for people and pets
- ◆ Special diet foods if needed (includes Kosher)
- ◆ Medications
- ◆ Fun foods, snacks
- ◆ Waterproof matches



First Aid Kit

- ◆ Moist towelettes
- ◆ Hand sanitizer
- ◆ Sterile bandages in different sizes
- ◆ Elastic wrap (Ace Bandage)
- ◆ Gauze, Tape
- ◆ Scissors, tweezers, needle, safety pins
- ◆ Waterproof matches to sterilize
- ◆ Antiseptic (alcohol, hydrogen peroxide, ointment)
- ◆ Aspirin, acetaminophen, etc.
- ◆ Antacid, Laxative, Anti-diarrhea medicine
- ◆ Thermometer
- ◆ Water, ice

Other

- ◆ Photo inventory of home on CD or flash drive
- ◆ Recent photos of family & pets on CD, flash drive, phone or tablet
- ◆ Full gas tanks for all vehicles
- ◆ Fuel for outdoor stove
- ◆ Cell phones charged
- ◆ All other electronics charged
