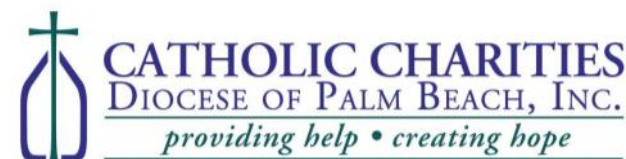

Birthline/Lifeline Pregnancy Care Centers
