

SUMMARY OF PALM BEACH DIOCESE NON-PAROCIAL COLLECTIONS — JULY 2015 TO JUNE 2016

Diocese of Palm Beach Financial Report

As we have reported in the past, the chart to the right reflects the details associated with the monthly non-parochial collections taken up in the parishes. Parishes submit the total amount received for a given collection directly to the diocesan Finance Office which, in turn, forwards the funds to the appropriate party. Most of these collections fall under the philanthropic authority of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Office of National Collections, which receives the proceeds from dioceses across the country and sends the funds to the ultimate beneficiaries. Some collections are shared between the U.S. conference beneficiary and the local diocese. Other collections are designated for the exclusive use of the Diocese of Palm Beach. This chart reflects some instances where there is no dollar amount shown for a particular parish and collection. This simply means the collected amount was not reported and submitted to the diocesan Finance Office within the required 60 days of the scheduled collection.
