Knight previously held a number of positions at the Urban League, including Project Director for the agency's health programs focused on tobacco prevention, eliminating secondhand smoke exposure, STEM education for girls of color, and environmental justice. Knight has also led the groundbreaking and transformative work of the League's Saving Our Sons-Sowing Opportunity Now (SON) program uniquely designed for young Black males ages 16-24.

Knight's most recent role at the League was Director of Health, Wellness and Youth, where she leads a talented team of professionals working on a number of initiatives aimed at youth empowerment including: Educational Empowerment; Economic Empowerment; Health and Quality of Life Empowerment; and Civil Rights, Racial Equity, and Justice Empowerment. In addition, she has served as a Co-Facilitator and Trainer within the Urban League's division of Racial Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and is a much sought after presenter and speaker on these meaningful social values. Even in her new and expanded leadership role, Lisa will continue to guide, direct, manage a d advance many Urban League community initiatives and serve as its representative on a number of local, state, and national platforms.
