1. Call to Order:

4. Old Business

a. <u>Approved Resolution No. 2017-01</u>; A Resolution of the Village Council of the Village of Golf, Florida, expressing the Village's support and intention to create within its boundaries, the "Renewpace Program" a voluntary program providing interested property owners with the opportunity to finance energy efficiency, renewable energy and wind resistance improvements on their property by repayment through Non-Ad Valorem assessments on their property tax bill; approving and adopting the second amended and restated interlocal agreement originally executed by the towns of Lantana and Mangonia Park in order to become a party to the agreement with the Florida Green Finance Authority for administration of the Renewpace Program in the Village of Golf; providing an effective date; and for other purposes.

Attorney Biggs read the Resolution by title only. This Resolution was held over from last meeting. Council wanted to see the Interlocal Agreement between Florida Green Finance Authority and the Towns of Lantana and Mangonia

Approved Resolution No. 2017-04; A Resolution of the Village Council of the Village of Golf, Florida, adopting a Resolution of support and joining the Interlocal Agreement creating the "Green Corridor Property Assessment Clean Energy (PACE) District" (The District) in accordance with Section 163.01(7), Florida Statutes; approving the selection of Ygrene Energy Fund, Florida LLC as the Administrator for the District and allowing for financing of qualifying improvements within the Village of Golf pursuant to Section 163.08, Florida Statutes; authorizing approval of a membership agreement between The District and the Village of Golf, providing an effective date; and for other purposes.

Attorney Biggs read the Resolution by title only. Council was provided the Interlocal Agreement between the Town of Cutler Bay, Village of Palmetto Bay, Village of Pinecrest, City of South Miami, Miami Shores Village, City of Coral Gables and the City of Miami.

Motion was made by Council Member Botos seconded by Council Member Windle and Voice Vote Showed: unanimously carried to approve Resolution No. 2017-04. Council also approved the agreement between the Green Corridor Property Assessment Clean Energy (PACE) District NAYS - 0 and the Village of Golf.

c. Approved Resolution No. 2017-05; A Resolution of the Village Council of the Village of Golf, Florida, expressing the Village's support and intention to join with the parties to the Interlocal Agreement creating the Florida Resiliency and Energy District ("FRED") Property Assessed Clean Energy ("PACE") Program within the Village Boundaries; providing interested property owners with the opportunity to finance energy efficiency, renewable energy and wind resistance improvements on their property tax bill; authorizing approval of the limited purpose party membership with "FRED" and the third party administrator in the Village of Golf; providing an effective date; and for other purposes. Attorney Biggs read the Resolution by title only. Council was provided the Interlocal Agreement relating to the creation of the Florida Resiliency and Energy District (FRED).

Motion was made by Council Member Botos, seconded by Council Member Windle and unanimously carried to approve Resolution No. 2017-05. Council also approved the AYES - 5 agreement between the Florida Resiliency and Energy District (FRED) and the Village of Golf.

6. Public Participation

Mr. Good suggested that the Village of Golf, Country Club of Florida, Par Club and RHS meet to review Emergency Preparedness. Council was in agreement.

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7. Manager's Report

The Manager reported the following:

- Elections Update: There will be no election. No one filed to run against the incumbents. This saved the \$10,000 which was budgeted for an election.
- Quail Ridge: has been advised by Lake Worth Drainage District that they must replace a section of storm drain that crosses Golf Road. The southernmost 40 foot of pipe needs to be excavated and replaced. We are not sure if Golf Road traffic will be impacted. 20-30 feet of our ficus hedge and fence will need to be removed and replaced to accommodate the pipe replacement.
- Traffic Hawk: seems to be having an impact, having sent email notices to residents who have violated the speed limit. Only 1 person has repeated the violation.
- Golf Road Speed Assessment: the assessment shows that the majority of people do the speed limit. This does not rise to the level of more enforcement even though a few speeders create the perception of a problem. PBSO continues to do periodic radar speed enforcement.
 - A few residents have voiced concerns about the speed of traffic and the hazards of trying to exit the Village onto Golf Road.
 - Manager Thrower will reach out to the County Traffic Engineer to see about traffic calming near our entrance.
- HB 17; expressly preempts the regulation of businesses, professions and occupations to the state. The bill provides that after January 1, 2017, a local government may not adopt or impose a new requirement (including any regulation, license, permit or fee) on a "business, profession or occupation" unless the requirement is "expressly authorized by general law".
- Lighting Park C; pilot project. Due to lack of lighting, the Homeowners Association would like gently illuminate some of the trees in Park C. The Association is reaching out to the surrounding residents for their approval.
- Palm Beach County City Management Association: The Manager has been selected to serve as a representative to the County Penny Sales Tax Oversite Committee. This committee serves as an audit body, ensuring the projects being undertaken meet the statutory requirements voters approved.
